

- Second most spoken native language worldwide and the second language of international communication.
- Spanish, the official language in twenty-one countries, is the third most widely-spoken language in the world.

• More than 400 million people speak Spanish worldwide.



- Experts predict that by the year 2050, there will be 530 million Spanish speakers, of which 100 million will be living in the United States.
- You could spend all your life travelling between each Spanishspeaking country and never see the same location twice.

The E-bacc could affect you!

- All future school leavers could have an MFL
- Your son will be massively disadvantaged if he doesn't
- Current government plans
 suggest that everyone will
 take the E-bacc in future.





- Each language skill will have a 25% weighting.
- <u>AO1 Listening</u>: understand and respond to different types of spoken language (25%).
- AO2 Speaking: communicate and interact in speech (25%).
- <u>AO3 Reading</u>: understand and respond to different types of written language (25%).
- AO4 Writing: communicate in writing (25%).





- Focus on independent and spontaneous use of the <u>target language</u>
- Increased emphasis on the <u>culture</u> and identities of the countries and communities where the language is spoken.
- The course covers a variety of contexts linked to themes
- Theme 1: People and lifestyle
- Theme 2: Popular Culture
- Theme 3: Communication and the world around us.
- <u>Translation</u> into English and from English into the target language

- There are also strong cross curricular links with a wide range of other subjects including Citizenship, Geography, History, Religious Studies and Sociology.




